TOWN OF MOCKSVILLE REGULAR BOARD MEETING JULY 3, 2012

The Town of Mocksville Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, July 3, 2012 at 4:00 p.m. in the Mocksville Town Hall.

Mayor F.W. Slate called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Commissioner Will Marklin to approve the minutes of the June 5, 2012 Regular Board Meeting and the June 26, 2012 Special Called Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lash Sanford and approved by a unanimous vote.

Public Comment - None

Proposal for Development of a Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan

Jerry Myers with Davie County Emergency Services informed the board that as a result of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and NC Senate Bill 300, each local government is required to have an approved Hazard Mitigation Plan in order to apply for hazard mitigation funding. The counties of Forsyth, Davie, Yadkin, Surry, Stokes, Rockingham and Caswell and their incorporated jurisdictions propose to develop a regional hazard mitigation plan. Forsyth County has agreed to act as the lead jurisdiction in the process which will entail managing the finances of the grant should it be awarded.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lash Sanford to approve the agreement to participate in a regional hazard mitigation plan for Forsyth, Davie, Yadkin, Surry, Stokes, Rockingham and Caswell counties. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rob Taylor and approved by a unanimous vote.

Street Improvement Update

Manager Bralley informed the board of pretreatment of patching and smoothing out of some secondary streets inside the town limits. NCDOT is recommending that these streets be treated with a BST or chip seal treatment with an estimated cost of \$105,000.00 for eleven streets. Public Works Director Mike West explained that this type of treatment is basically the old tar and gravel treatment. The main thoroughfares will continue to be treated with the same paving treatment as normal. The public will be notified by a letter sent out with the July water bills and an article in the Davie County Enterprise. This type of street treatment is eco-friendly and will have an estimated \$400,000 savings compared to the asphalt resurfacing.

Interlocal Agreement with Davie County

Manager Bralley introduced the Interlocal Agreement with Davie County. This agreement is proposed for a three (3) year term with the exception of Recreation being a one (1) year term. The agreement lists the services Davie County and the Town of Mocksville share and provide.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rob Taylor to accept the Interlocal Agreement with the County of Davie. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Will Marklin and approved by a unanimous vote.

Animal Shelter Lease Agreement

The Animal Shelter Lease Agreement is with Davie County. The Town of Mocksville will provide the property with no rent. The premises shall be used for animal protection and control to the citizens of the Town on the same basis that the County provides to the citizens of Davie County. The lease agreement is to be renewed every three (3) years.

A motion was made by Commissioner Will Marklin to renew the Animal Shelter Lease Agreement with Davie County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Richard Broadway and approved by a unanimous vote.
