**Manager's Report**

Manager Bralley informed the board that the town had applied for grant funding to assist with job creation and reuse of an existing building. With the recent announcement of CPP Global relocating to the Kaydon site, with approximately 140 jobs and an investment of \$5.4 million, the town has been selected for a building reuse and restoration grant. The grant amount is \$480,000.00 to assist with the purpose of reusing a vacant building for CPP Global from the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Center. Representative Julia Howard was very instrumental in recommending that the town be selected for the funding. Appreciation is also extended to local Economic Development President, Terry Bralley for his persistence with CPP Global and creation of new jobs and tax base in Mocksville.

In addition to this grant, the Rural Center has invited the town to submit application for the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure program. This grant would assist with water and sewer for the same site in the amount of \$327,320.00.

The Town of Mocksville will advertise for Request for Qualifications for Engineering Services. John Grey, Grey Engineering will begin transitioning current projects and closing the firm over the next 12 months due to health reasons.

Arbor Day will be April 20, 2012 at 11:00 a.m. The Mayor, the Woman's Club and the Leadership class at Mocksville Elementary School will be assisting in the planting of trees.

Spring Clean up will be held on Saturday, April 21, 2012 at Rich Park. Free mulch will also be given away on that same day.

Bralley informed the board of an Eagle Scout Project by town resident, Douglas Brown. The town is always proud to accept Eagle Scout projects for the community improvement and for support of qualifying for Eagle Scout. The project included the rebuilding of one (1) bridge and the upgrading and repairs of two (2) other bridges in Rich Park. Brown also assisted with beautification and maintenance of the Butterfly Garden in Rich Park.
