The Town of Mocksville Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, January 7, 2014 at 4:00 p.m. in the Mocksville Town Hall.

Mayor Slate called the meeting to order welcoming everyone in attendance.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Commissioner Rob Taylor to approve the minutes of the December 3, 2013 Regular Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Johnny Frye and approved by a unanimous vote.

Hugh A. Lagle Water Treatment Plant WWT Project

Chuck Willis with Willis Engineers presented to the board an update on the Hugh A. Lagle Water Treatment Plant WWT Project. The survey team is underway with the design. The drawings have been finished and the bidding process should begin in the spring with construction starting in the summer. Willis stated that the plant staff has been very good in assisting with improvements which has been holding down the cost. Valves have been replaced and the wooden baffles will be the next to be replaced. The sampling program and the monitoring process have been started. Manager Bralley stated that an email has been received from the state complimenting Radenka Dragas and some of the changes that have been implemented at the plant. Willis stated that Dragas has succeeded the standards for performance at the plant.

Mayor Slate thanked Mr. Willis for such a good report.

Surplus Property – Notice of Public Auction

Manager Bralley informed the board of four (4) vehicles from the Mocksville Police Department to be sold at Public Auction. The vehicles will be advertised for Public Auction.

A motion was made by Commissioner Johnny Frye to surplus the four (4) vehicles at public auction. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Will Marklin and approved by a unanimous vote.

Manager's Report

Bralley informed the board of additional surplus items that are in different categories. The Fire Department has inventoried property which has no value therefore does not require a motion to surplus. Some items that are useable are being moved to Public Works and the Water Plant. Most of the items have no value and will not be listed as surplus property for sale. A sale will be held at a later date.

The Police Department has more items for surplus that are low value and some are found property items. The found property items consist of 8-10 bicycles. The items will have to be advertised ten (10) days prior to the sale.

The current temperature has made some changes in jobs. Water and sewer lines have been affected. Duke Power sent a notice to post in reference to conserving energy.

The lights on the Four Oak trees are scheduled to be removed Sunday, January 12, 2014.

Streets throughout the town have been cut for water repairs and are in need of asphalt. The asphalt cannot be placed until the spring.

Daniel Matthews with the Mocksville Police Department informed the board of the continuing education of the Police Department. Andrew Beck was sponsored by the Mocksville Police Department at Davidson County Community College and graduated top of his class for Basic Law Enforcement Training.

Commissioners Report

Commissioner Vaughan-Jones thanked the Police Department and the Fire Department. She also thanked the Town for the Christmas gathering. She also thanked the Public Works Department for their hard work this time of year especially.

Commissioner Marklin reported that the back fence is down at Rich Park and will be replaced soon. The Recreation committee will meet Thursday, January 9, 2014 to discuss the upcoming Recreation bond vote in May.

Commissioner Frye expressed his appreciation to all departments for jobs well done. He stated that he was extremely proud of the first responders.

Commissioner Sanford stated that he would like to visit the departments and learn more about them.

Manager Bralley will schedule a visit to the Hugh A. Ladle Water Treatment Plant in the spring.
