**Public Hearing – Monarch Section 5310 Program Grant for Enhanced Mobility of Senior and Individuals with Disabilities Program**

Monarch is applying for a transportation grant from the NC Department of Transportation to provide funding for transportation for the services they support via YVEDDI to and from the program on a daily basis. The grant is called a 5310 Grant: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program.

**Engineers Update**

Chuck Willis with Willis Engineers gave an update on the Buck Seaford Road Water line. The line has been tested and in service. The connections to the residents will be made in the upcoming weeks.

Willis stated that we are working with the contractors and coordinating the waterline project and the sewer line project for Gildan Yarns. Plans for construction are almost complete. Projects will be advertised for bids and should be ready for the January meeting.

The plans for the wash water facilities at water plant should be ready for bidding at the same time.

**Manager's Report**

Manager Christine Bralley reported everything was in compliant with the waste water inspection. Inspectors complimented the Public Works staff and employees for doing a very good job developing and implementing the program.

A letter was received from Foster Drug Company in reference to Officer Stuart Shore. Shore was involved with the National Drug Take Back. Foster Drug owners and staff were very appreciative of Shore and the Police Department for their participation in the Take Back.

A Thank you from the Davie Community Foundation was received in appreciation to the Community Development Services for their façade grant for the new office. The Town of Mocksville and Leon Carter helped facilitate the grant.

There will be a Veterans Day observance held on November 11, 2014 at 11:00 am in front of the monument.

“Twas the Night Before...Bed Races will be held on November 21, 2014 with the Mocksville Christmas parade the following day.

The Fire Department, Police Department and the Recreation Department had participants from the Big Brother/Big Sister kid's day of job shadowing.

Manager Bralley informed the board the Police Department continued making improvements to the Evidence Room. Some items were declared surplus and several items were scraped, with Public Works assisting in getting these things removed. The total was \$210.74 for scrap metal which will be returned to the General fund as an amendment in their budget. Bralley also commended the Chief in working with the department in reference to the police weapons and ammunition. The total for firearms was approximately \$4000.00 and the total of ammunition was \$12,184.00.

**Commissioner Report**

Commissioner Vaughan-Jones thanked the departments for working on making each department more efficient. Halloween went over well. She stated that she is interested in seeing the change that will happen at I-40.

Commissioner Taylor has heard several complaints turn to compliments in reference to Interstate 40. Taylor complimented Lt. Robbins that he has noticed a difference in the reports from the Police Department in his line of work. Taylor reported that it is time to update the tennis courts at South Davie.

Commissioner Marklin was impressed with the Halloween and trick-or-treating on Main Street.

Commissioner Sanford also talked about the trick-or-treating on Main Street.

Chief Penley stated how well everything went on Halloween and that he was amazed at all the traffic.

Fire Department Chief Frank Carter reminded the board of the invitations for the Christmas Dinner.

Attorney Hank Van Hoy also talked about the Halloween traffic on North Main Street.
