

**Town of Mocksville  
Regular Board Meeting  
June 2, 2015**

The Town of Mocksville Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, June 2, 2015 at 4:00 p.m. in the Mocksville Town Hall.

Mayor Slate called the meeting to order, welcoming everyone in attendance.

**Approval of Minutes**

*A motion was made by Commissioner Rob Taylor to approve the minutes of the May 5, 2015 Regular Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Will Marklin and approved by a unanimous vote.*

**Resolution to Adopt the Northern Piedmont Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan**

Manager Bralley introduced a Resolution to Adopt the Northern Piedmont Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan. Jerry Myers with Emergency Management explained to the board that the original plan was going to expire in 2018. FEMA wants to have regional plans from now on so the Town of Mocksville has partnered with Caswell County, Davie County, Rockingham County, Stokes County, Surry County and Yadkin County and prepared a multi-jurisdictional hazard mitigation plan. This plan will expire in 2020 instead of 2018.

*A motion was made by Commissioner Johnny Frye to approve the Resolution to Adopt the Northern Piedmont Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lash Sanford and approved by a unanimous vote.*

**Addendum to Contract #1 between Envirolink and the Town of Mocksville**

Bralley introduced an Addendum to the contract date April 2, 2013 between Envirolink and the Town of Mocksville. The current contract states that in the event of the Town operator’s absence from work, the Town will assume responsibility for staffing the plant in the operator’s absence. The change will state that the Town and/or Envirolink will assume responsibility for staffing the plant in the operator’s absence.

*A motion was made by Commissioner Will Marklin to approve the Addendum to Contract #1 between Envirolink and the Town of Mocksville. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Amy Vaughan-Jones and approved by a unanimous vote.*

**Area Wide Optimization Program (AWOP) Award and Recognition**

Manager Bralley informed the board of the Area Wide Optimization Program (AWOP). The AWOP program was developed to help water systems meet successively more stringent regulations and achieve higher levels of water quality. The Town of Mocksville received an award and recognition from the state and from the NCDENR. Town employee water plant operators optimized this procedure. NCDENR was very complimentary stating that Mocksville residents are receiving the best water ever due to this procedure. The Town of Mocksville was 1 of 42 towns and cities in North Carolina that was recognized for this award. Radenka Dragas was instrumental for the implementation of the program for the Town of Mocksville.

**2015-2016 Budget Message**

Manager Bralley presented the 2015-2016 fiscal year budget to the board. The budget is balanced at \$8,472,285.00. The tax rate will remain the same .29 per \$100 valuation. There will be an increase in the water and sewer rates and an increase in late fees of \$5. Economic Development project incentives and grants include Gildan Yarn, Avgol American, Inc. and Quality Drive Extension. There is approximately \$910,000 for Capital Improvement projects for Water and Sewer. Improvements include the tennis courts at South Davie, Rich Park Shelter and Greenway and technology. Some of the current year accomplishments include the non-potable water project at Durchman Creek WWTP, I-40 landscape improvements, Rich Park Greenway, new road and waterline installation to Gildan Yarn, and Economic Development Projects that include Gildan Yarn and Dunlop Aircraft Tyres. Bralley thanked the Mayor and the board for their continued support and leadership. Bralley also thanked the staff, department employees, contractors, legal counsel volunteers and caring residents for their continued efforts of support in providing the citizens of Mocksville with services regarded as top priority in the most effective and efficient manner.

*A motion was made by Commissioner Lash Sanford to adopt the budget and set a public hearing date for June 15, 2015 at 5:00 pm in the Mocksville Town Hall. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Amy Vaughan-Jones and approved by a unanimous vote.*

**Managers’ Report**

The Girl Scouts have worked on the improvement at the tennis courts at South Davie. Public Works has also worked on making repairs.

Bralley stated that the fee schedule changes are: Privilege License has been eliminated effective June 30, 2015 and there is an increase in the late penalty of \$5.

**Commissioners Report**

Commissioner Vaughan-Jones stated that she is proud of the budget and expressed her thanks to Christine and the board.

Commissioner Taylor mentioned the Kidsfest that took place in May. He expressed appreciation to the Fire Department. Approximately 1000 people attended. The Police and Sheriff's Departments also participated.

Commissioner Marklin stated another Boy Scout will be calling about an Eagle Scout project.

Commissioner Frye expressed his appreciation for a job well done.

Commissioner Sanford encourages the other members of the board to tour the greenway.

Town Attorney, Hank Van Hoy, informed the board that the time is up for the condemnation of the old C.Wayne McDonald property located at 715 Yadkinville Road. The town now has the right to demo and salvage material on the property. Manager Bralley stated that an asbestos testing will have to be done first before contractors will be involved.
