Mayor Slate called the meeting to order, welcoming everyone in attendance.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Commissioner Rob Taylor to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2015 Regular Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Will Marklin and approved by a unanimous vote.

Public Hearing – Monarch NC Department of Transportation Grant

Laurie Weaver with Monarch informed the board that they were applying for a transportation grant. Monarch is a non-profit that provides services in Davie County to individuals with intellectual and development disabilities at the New Horizons Day Program. The grant is from the NC Department of Transportation to provide funding for transportation of the people that are supported via YVEDDI to and from that day program on a daily basis. The grant is called a 5310 Grant: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and individuals with Disabilities Program.

Mayor Slate opened the Public Hearing with Laurie Weaver expressing appreciation to the Town Board for their consideration of the grant. Mayor Slate closed the public hearing with no one speaking in opposition of the Monarch NC Department of Transportation Grant.

A motion was made by Commissioner Will Marklin to approve the 5310 Grant: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and individuals with Disabilities Program. The Motion was seconded by Commissioner Johnny Frye and approved by a unanimous vote.

Resolution – Piedmont Antique Power Association
