Court Square Tree Species Selection Survey

The Town of Mocksville is asking our residents to provide input in the selection process of the tree species that will be replanted this fall in Court Square. The Town has reviewed a variety of species recommended by arborists as being a good fit for the soil type and environment in our downtown, and has narrowed down the list to three remaining species. Nuttall Oak Tree

This tree reaches about 100 feet in height and produce acorns once every two to four years. They produce very few surface roots and are tolerant of droughts and flooding, making them very popular for parks and landscapes everywhere. Leaves can have an orange and red tint in the fall and green spring tint.



Shumard Oak Tree

The Shumard Oak tree grows to about 40-60 feet in height, and is typically used for a shade tree. Their beautiful color in the fall makes it very popular in parks and other recreational areas.



Willow Oak Tree

The Willow Oak Tree can reach up to 120 feet in height, but usually grow within the 60-70 foot range. Producing leaves that are about 2 inches long, this tree is also very popular for parks and landscapes. This was the same tree species that were originally planted in the Mocksville Court Square in 1934, and remained until having to be removed in 2015 and 2017.
