It's easy to find out when there's an event taking place in downtown Mocksville; check out the events calendar on the home page.

Make plans to attend the DC Cruisers "Cruise-In" happening from 5:00-8:00 p.m. on the first Monday of the month from April to October.

The Town hosts a Farmers Market on Wednesday afternoons from 3-6 PM from April to November with local certified producers. The market is located in the parking lot at Junker's Mill Outdoor Theatre, next door to the Davie County Chamber of Commerce, just across the street from the Mocksville Town Hall Parking Lot located at 171 S. Clement St in Mocksville, and just a block down W Depot Street from the town square. Enjoy a great variety of produce and homemade products for sample and sale.

Other popular events include the annual **Daniel Boone Family Festival**, the first Saturday in May, with re-enactors, historical tours, music, games, vendors and more to commemorate this famous Davie County resident. Frontiersman Daniel Boone once called Mocksville home and his parents are buried here in Joppa Cemetery.

The Oaks Festival

This festival takes place on the town square in historic downtown Mocksville on the second Saturday in October. It features live music, a kid's area, artisans, and crafters.

Twas The Night Before The Bed Race



The “Twas the Night Before Bed Race” happens on the Friday evening before Thanksgiving and kicks off the holiday events taking place around town. Contestants build a themed handmade bed and race down Main Street for a cash prize. This is followed by the Mocksville Christmas Parade, a family favorite, held the first Saturday in December.

Catch a local Davie High or American Legion Baseball game, a Mocksville-Davie Parks and Rec softball game, take a trail walk, have a picnic, make good use of the playgrounds or just enjoy nature at Rich Park, just down the street from the Davie Family YMCA.
